

MINUTES OF THE PUBLIC TEST AND INSPECTION FOR THE PRIMARY ELECTION CONDUCTED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF KANAWHA COUNTY, WEST VIRGINIA, HELD AT THE VOTER WAREHOUSE LOCATED AT 900 CHRISTOPHER STREET AND THE VOTER REGISTRATION OFFICE LOCATED AT 415 QUARRIER STREET, CHARLESTON, WEST VIRGINIA ON THE 4TH DAY OF MAY, 2010 FOR THE MAY 11, 2010 PRIMARY ELECTION.

The County Commission of Kanawha County, West Virginia convened at 8:05 a.m. on May 4th, 2010 at the Voter Registration Warehouse located at 900 Christopher Street, Charleston, West Virginia and the Voter Registration Office located at 415 Quarrier Street, Charleston, West Virginia for the Public Test and Inspection for the May 11, 2010 Primary Election.

Present were W. Kent Carper, President, Dave Hardy, Commissioner, Henry C. Shores, Commissioner, Brent Pauley, County Manager, Jennifer Sayre, Deputy County Manager, Vera McCormick, County Clerk, David Dodd, Deputy County Clerk, Pat Fisher, Registrar, Michael Stadjuhar, Republican Ballot Commissioner, Sandra Kay Miller, Democratic Ballot Commissioner, Marc Slotnick, County Attorney, Rod Coles, Mark Dawson, Voter Registration, John Caudill, Building and Grounds Maintenance, and Geneva Love, Election Systems & Software.

The County Commission conducted a Public Inspection at 8:07 a.m. with Michael Stadjuhar, Republican Ballot Commissioner and Sandra Kay Miller, Democratic Ballot Commissioner present. Vera McCormick stated that machines from all 160 precincts have been previously tested. Inspection of voting machines for precincts 415 and 365 was completed with a zero totaled out receipt printed. Voter Warehouse doors were locked and will remain locked until machines are moved to correct precincts for Election Day. At 9:00 a.m., 263 ballots were scanned through the M100s at Voter Registration. At 9:10 a.m., Vera McCormick opened seals on supply boxes for precincts 254 and 321. This was to verify contents and then they were resealed (see attached documents). The room containing election supplies was locked and is to remain locked until supplies are handed out for Election Day. Commissioners verified that the test was run and that the tabulation was correct with a total count of 263 ballots; 160 Democratic Party Ballots, 76 Republican Party Ballots, 23 Mountain Party Ballots, and 4 Non-Partisan Ballots. Upon completion the room was locked at 9:43 a.m. and is to remain locked until Election Day.

Commissioner Hardy moved to recess the public test at 9:45 a.m. Commissioner Carper seconded. Motion carried.

Per Commissioner Carper let the record reflect that locks were removed from the Voter Registration office on April 20, 2010 at 9:00 a.m. for the purpose of early voting.
